THE MOST HOLY NAME OF JESUS

4TH JANUARY, 2026

Pax Christi,

A happy and holy New Year to everyone. We hope you grow in grace throughout the year, making and keeping resolutions to improve in the spiritual life. Most people make and break (quickly) their New Year's resolutions, as they are often not made with a great deal of prudence. But with all things truly spiritual, such as resolutions to work on our spiritual life, we need reason and perseverance to carry out our plans. God is more than willing to help us as we advance toward our ultimate goal of full union with Him, but the main hindrance is always ourselves. Make this year a time of consistency in prayer. It is too easy to pray when there is a fleeting motivation, such as a great need, or a time of sorrow or reflection on something that has gone wrong. But, in order to become more human, we need to grow more into the creatures God made us to be, namely, in union with our own source, God. Set yourself achievable goals in prayer and stay committed to them whether or not your motivation is there. Pray as if God is standing beside you, pray as if your life depends on your doing so every day. You will have days when you are more attuned to the prayer and others when you are not, but it is consistency that matters. The hardest part is praying when you don't want to, but that is also the most rewarding time, since it takes courage to do the difficult good.

On Monday evening we will bless the Epiphany water. In case of bad weather, we will move the blessing to the hall.

Next Sunday we will be beginning a 30 day prayer preparation for an act of consecration to the Blessed Virgin Mary on the feast of Our Lady of Fatima. We would like everyone to pray one decade of the rosary (1 Our Father, 10 Hail Mary's & 1 Glory be) and a *Memorare* up to and including the 11th of February. These prayers can be prayed in any language one wants. On the 11th FSSP priests will gather in Fatima and make a consecration of all of the chapels and parishes and all the priests and faithful attending those places in the world to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Last year we did the same in Lourdes and this year we want to renew our act of love to our Mother in heaven asking for her continued protection on all of us in these incredulous times. For those who do not know the words of the *Memorare*, here they are.

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thy intercession, was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my Mother. To thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen.


