SEPTUAGESIMA SUNDAY

1ST FEBRUARY, 2026

Pax Christi,

Today is Septuagesima Sunday, which comes from the Latin word for seventy because it is *roughly* 70 days before Easter. Septuagesima is the pre-Lenten period in which we ease ourselves into the season of Lent, which of course is the period of fasting and penance which the Church provides for us each year to prepare ourselves for Easter. However we are not just plunged into the penances of Lent, rather the Church offers us this two and a half week period to ease ourselves into it and get ready for what lies ahead.

To this end, we are once again doing our Virtus Programme, which runs from Septuagesima Sunday (today) till the Sunday after Easter (Low Sunday), which sets out penances and prayers to do during the Septuagesima and Lenten period. Please see this QR code for more details and to register.



With Septuagesima also comes the burying of the *Alleluia* which we did last night after Vespers. During Septuagesima and Lent, the joyous parts of the liturgy are slowly taken away. First the *Alleluia* which won't be said at all until the Easter Vigil. The Gloria will no longer be said on Sundays either. With Lent the organ will go silent and flowers will not adorn the altar except on big feasts. Two weeks before Easter all images will be covered, and in Holy Week we will not celebrate any other feast. On Good Friday we even lose the celebration of Mass and the presence of Our Lord Himself in the Tabernacle. And so we see how during this time we are progressively deprived of the joy of the liturgy, culminating in the loss of Our Lord Himself on the day of His sorrowful death. The burial of the *Alleluia* is the beginning of this and reminds us of the sorrow that lies ahead. But nonetheless, we look forward to the joy and glory of Easter when the Risen Christ will conquer and all that was lost, both liturgically, and actually in the realm of grace, is gloriously restored.

Finally, tomorrow is Candlemas, we will have a 7pm Sung Mass at St. Paul's with the blessing of Candles and Procession beforehand (Low Mass with no blessing at 7am). You may bring *Beeswax* Candles to be blessed before the 7pm Mass.

REMEMBER, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thy intercession, was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my Mother. To thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen.

SEPTUAGESIMA SUNDAY

Matt 20:1-16

INTROIT

Ps 17:5-7; Ps 17:2-3

The terrors of death surged round me, the cords of the nether world enmeshed me. In my distress I called upon the Lord; from His holy temple He heard my voice. *Ps.* I love You, O Lord, my strength, O Lord, my rock, my fortress, my deliverer.

EPISTLE

1 Cor. 9:24-27; 10:1-5

Know you not that they that run in the race, all run indeed, but one receiveth the prize? So run that you may obtain. And every one that striveth for the mastery, refraineth himself from all things: and they indeed that they may receive a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible one. I therefore so run, not as at an uncertainty: I so fight, not as one beating the air: But I chastise my body, and bring it into subjection: lest perhaps, when I have preached to others, I myself should become a castaway. For I would not have you ignorant, brethren, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea. And all in Moses were baptised, in the cloud, and in the sea: And did all eat the same spiritual food, And all drank the same spiritual drink; and they drank of the spiritual rock that followed them, and the rock was Christ. But with most of them God was not well pleased: for they were overthrown in the desert.

GOSPEL



HE kingdom of heaven is like to an householder, who went out early in the morning to hire labourers into his vineyard. And he said to them: Go you also into my vineyard, and I will give you what shall be just. And they went their way. And again he went out about the sixth and the ninth hour, and did in like manner. But about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing, and he saith to them: Why stand you here all the day idle? They say to him: Because no man hath hired us. He saith to them: Go you also into my vineyard. And when evening was come, the lord of the vineyard saith to his steward: Call the labourers and pay them their hire, beginning from the last even to the first. When therefore they were come, that came about the eleventh hour, they received every man a penny. But when the first also came, they thought that they should receive more: and they also received every man a penny. And receiving it they murmured against the master of the house, Saying: These last have worked but one hour, and thou hast made them equal to us, that have borne the burden of the day and the heats. But he answering said to one of them: Friend, I do thee no wrong: didst thou not agree with me for a penny? Take what is thine, and go thy way: I will also give to this last even as to thee. Or, is it not lawful for me to do what I will? is thy eye evil, because I am good? "What I will": Viz., with my own, and in matters that depend on my own bounty. So shall the last be first, and the first last. For many are called, but few chosen.

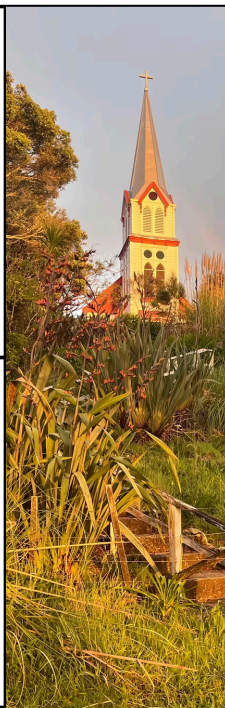
