THE THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT

8TH MARCH, 2026

Pax Christi,

This week we will pass the half way point of Lent, this Thursday is actually the half-way point, and so we will celebrate next Sunday with Lætare Sunday, where the organ and flowers will make a brief re-appearance and the vestments will switch from sorrowful violet to a more joyous rose. Lent moves quickly, perhaps not quickly enough for some however as our Lenten penances begin to draw out. But as we approach the half-way point during this week, it is a good opportunity for us to review how we are going and whether we are actually keeping our penances which we set out to do. Our original ideal for Lent may have slowly drifted away, and if that is so, let us review what has happened and how we can re-adjust and hit our targets. Let us also implore Our Lord for an increase in fervour so that over the remaining four weeks of Lent we can stick to our penances while offering them to God as a small sacrifice and as a means for us to continue to grow closer to Him. In our day and age, it can be difficult to practice Lenten penances with the world encouraging us to do the complete opposite. But stay firm, and do not give in, but rather, with renewed fervour let us stick to our original programme and use it to advance in our spiritual life. The half-way point is almost there, so stick to it.

And so with Easter just four weeks away, and Holy Week just three weeks away, please see the schedule for Holy Week on page three. All Masses and Liturgies will be at St. Paul's. Palm Sunday recalls Our Lord's triumphant entrance into Jerusalem which was done so He could suffer His Passion which will be the Gospel that day. Palm Sunday will follow the regular Mass time, the Low Mass will not have the blessing of Palms however, that blessing and procession will only be at the 10am Mass. Palms however will be available throughout Holy Week to pick up for yourself. Moreover, the Passion will be solemnly sung at the 10am Mass. During the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday) only one Mass/Liturgy can be offered each day, confessions will not be heard during those services as the *other* Priest will be attending Mass like everyone else. Holy Thursday will have a 7pm Mass which will recall the Last Supper and the first Mass. There will then be adoration until Midnight as we keep Our Lord company in the Garden of Gethsemane. Good Friday stations will be at 2pm (at St. Paul's and outside if weather permits) with the *Mass* of the Pre-sanctified at 3pm commemorating Our Lord's death at which the Passion will be solemnly sung. *Tenebrae* (Matins and Lauds of Holy Saturday sung by candlelight the evening before) will then be held at 7pm on Good Friday evening. This recalls Our Lord's burial in the tomb, we are keeping watch at Our Lord's tomb as we mourn while awaiting His Resurrection. The Easter Vigil will be held on Holy Saturday at 7pm, this Mass especially celebrates the entrance of converts into the Catholic Church (and we hope that a few will join then) as we await Our Lord's Resurrection on this holy night. Finally, we will of course celebrate His Glorious Resurrection on Easter Sunday with a 9am Sung Mass (not 8/10am). We encourage everyone to come to all these Masses and liturgies, let us truly make Christ the centre of Easter and let us orientate ourselves to Him this Lent.

THE THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT

INTROIT

Ps 24:15-16, 1-2

My eyes are ever toward the Lord, for He will free my feet from the snare. Look toward me, and have pity on me, for I am alone and afflicted. *Ps.* To You I lift up my soul, O Lord. In You, O my God, I trust; let me not be put to shame.

EPISTLE

Eph 5:1-9

Be ye therefore followers of God, as most dear children; And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath delivered himself for us, an oblation and a sacrifice to God for an odour of sweetness. But fornication, and all uncleanness, or covetousness, let it not so much as be named among you, as becometh saints: Or obscenity, or foolish talking, or scurrility, which is to no purpose; but rather giving of thanks. For know you this and understand, that no fornicator, or unclean, or covetous person (which is a serving of idols), hath inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God. Let no man deceive you with vain words. For because of these things cometh the anger of God upon the children of unbelief. Be ye not therefore partakers with them. For you were heretofore darkness, but now light in the Lord. Walk then as children of the light. For the fruit of the light is in all goodness, and justice, and truth;

Luke 11:14-28

And he was casting out a devil, and the same was dumb: and when he had cast out the devil, the dumb spoke: and the multitudes were in admiration at it: But some of them said: He casteth out devils by Beelzebub, the prince of devils. And others tempting, asked of him a sign from

heaven. But he seeing their thoughts, said to them: Every kingdom divided against itself, shall be brought to desolation, and house upon house shall fall. And if Satan also be divided against himself, how shall his kingdom stand? because you say, that through Beelzebub I cast out devils. Now if I cast out devils by Beelzebub; by whom do your children cast them out? Therefore they shall be your judges. But if I by the finger of God cast out devils; doubtless the kingdom of God is come upon you. When a strong man armed keepeth his court, those things are in peace which he possesseth. But if a stronger than he come upon him, and overcome him; he will take away all his armour wherein he trusted, and will distribute his spoils. He that is not with me, is against me; and he that gathereth not with me, scattereth. When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through places without water, seeking rest; and not finding, he saith: I will return into my house whence I came out. And when he is come, he findeth it swept and garnished. Then he goeth and taketh with him seven other spirits more wicked than himself, and entering in they dwell there. And the last state of that man becomes worse than the first. And it came to pass, as he spoke these things, a certain woman from the crowd, lifting up her voice, said to him: Blessed is the womb that bore thee, and the paps that gave thee suck. But he said: Yea rather, blessed are they who hear the word of God, and keep it.
