Pax Christi,

Today is the Octave day of Easter, called *Quasimodo* Sunday after the first words of the Introit and also called Low Sunday, which contrasts today to the great solemnity of last week. And in Latin it is known as *Dominica in albis deponendis*, which means; 'the Sunday of putting away the white garments.' Those who were baptised at the Easter Vigil received white Baptismal garments which signifies the purity of their souls, and in the early Church they wore them throughout the Easter Octave. They only took off their white garments this weekend, hence the name of today. They like us no longer exteriorly wear white garments, a sign of Baptismal purity. But hopefully they and ourselves too have not lost the grace of our Baptism.

But we are fallen human beings and unfortunately we at times commit the great evil of mortal sin. When this happens we lose the life of grace which we were reborn into at Baptism. The interior white garment of our soul is sullied, it is taken off, and instead of being risen with Christ into the life of grace we die and reject the sacrifice of the Cross. Baptism gives us grace and takes away the guilt of sin, but we do not become immune to sin. We unfortunately can still commit mortal sins, but the Church offers us a remedy. Christ has given us the sacrament of penance by which our sins are forgiven. And we hear about this sacrament in today's Gospel, for Christ "breathed on them, and He said to them: Receive ye the Holy Ghost: whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven them; and whose sins you shall retain, they are retained." With these words Our Lord instituted the sacrament of Penance.

The Church continues this theme by also calling today Divine Mercy Sunday. On the day Our Lord instituted the sacrament of Penance, the Church offers plenary indulgences to all those who "in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for sin, even venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honour of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus" such as 'Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!' This indulgence is given under the usual conditions which are; going to confession (within 3 weeks), receiving Holy Communion, praying for the intentions of the Holy Father and being detached from all sin. God's mercies are so immense that He not only forgives the guilt of our sins through the sacrament of penance, He also takes away the penalty of our sins through today's indulgences.

So, as we continue to glory in the Resurrection, let us bear in mind the fruits of Our Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection which He offers to us through the sacraments, particularly in the sacrament of Penance, by which we return to His grace. And let us take advantage of Divine Mercy Sunday, and gain the indulgences which the Risen Lord offers to us.

Finally, Pope Leo XIV has also asked that we pray for peace this weekend and the New Zealand Bishops have asked that we pray the Litany of Loretto for this intention which we will do after both of the Masses. The Risen Christ says 'Peace be to you.' May His peace reign!
