Pax Christi,

The great work of the Church which she was sent by Christ to do is to teach, to govern and to sanctify. She teaches in her doctrine and catechesis, and also on Sundays in sermons and in classes to all the world. She governs by the commandments of the Church and by other laws ordered through disciplines and practices overseen by the Bishops of the world. She sanctifies by the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, by the other sacraments, by blessings and by other devotions used generally and particularly. But the sanctification does not just happen when one attends these practices. The tools for holiness are provided by God through the means of His Church, but the grace will only be as effective as the tool it is acting on.

God's grace is always sufficient for our holiness, He will never be lacking in providing His part to our spiritual wellbeing. We must remember, He WANTS us to be with Him in heaven, thus, He provides the means necessary for us. The holy sacrifice of the Mass is (of course) the primary means of supernatural grace and it gives us a veritable tsunami of grace. But, as always with God, He will never force our wills to love Him, that part is entirely up to us, and unfortunately, we can be somewhat lax in this.

As fallen humans we can sometimes become very fixated on things we desire. Teenagers, falling in 'love' for the first time will think only of the one their heart desires. The other person consumes their thoughts, affects their decisions and influences their actions. Other people pursue wealth as a means to happiness. They put earning money as their focus and will stop at nothing to acquire more. They also become very stingy about their money which leads to avariciousness. Some others worry endlessly about their health, will follow all sorts of gurus or advice on staying healthy, yet none will prolong their lives one second. Others become very concerned about their looks, they work tirelessly to look 'good', spending time and money on their appearance and they have little time of sympathy for others who do not look 'great' in their opinion.

The list could go on. But why is it that we do not spend our time or energies on getting holier? Chasing love, wealth, health, beauty etc have no guarantees of success, whereas we can be 100% sure of our eventual passing from this world. Given the fact that God has gone to such great lengths to show His love for us and has left us with the means to get holy, we owe it to Him not to squander these most precious gifts. So, begin by being a better Catholic. Attending Sunday Mass is the bare minimum, it will fulfil your Sunday obligation, but there is so much more you can and should do. Learn and know your faith, be prepared to sit down and learn. Attend the classes which are put on for your benefit. Organise your prayer life, which means having a plan for how and when and what you will pray on a daily basis. Pray alone and/or with others. Attend spiritual conferences and recollections, spend time in adoration, read good and holy Catholic books. Get off devices and other vices, get into humility and virtues. Spend less time in idleness and scrolling and more time in becoming the person you are created to be. Time is short and we know not when the Master will come calling. If you want advice on these practices, speak to your priests, that's our job.
