Pax Christi,

The registrations have opened online for places on this year's Footsteps of Pompallier Pilgrimage (FOPP). This pilgrimage which retraces the footsteps of Bishop Pompallier when he travelled on foot from the Hokianga Harbour across the upper North Island to the Bay of Islands and back again as part of his evangelisation of New Zealand. Our aim this year is two-fold. Firstly to honour Bishop Pompallier and the sacrifice that he and the other early missionaries had when travelling to these shores and secondly to re-awaken the spirit of evangelisation in our country. New Zealand has reverted to paganism and is gravely in need of the Word of God. Pilgrimages are a most excellent means of showcasing faith in action, with the missionary zeal of hard physical effort aligned with mortification, self sacrifice and prayer.

This will be our second FOPP and we have made some necessary adjustments in the route, the speed of the walk, the length of the daily walks and the sleeping arrangements. This year the route will begin in the Bay of Islands at Opuia and walk through the beautiful Opuia forest through to Ohaewai. The second day will be a short day walking from Ohaewai to Okaihau, then taking a bus up State Highway 1 to Mangamuka, then a short walk to our Marae stay. This way, we will avoid walking on the main road, thus avoiding traffic. The third day will be a walk into the Hokianga to the Ngai Tupoto Marae on the shores of the harbour. This Marae has the beautiful Our Lady of the Assumption Church on its grounds. On the route we will stop for Mass and lunch at Totara Point where the first Mass was celebrated in New Zealand. The fourth day is another short day in which we will walk to Motuti to visit the church with the body of Bishop Pompallier lies, and we will have time to venerate his realics. After that we will return to Auckland.

By using four days, we spread the load of the walk and although having to take a day off work (on the Tuesday), we avoid the chaotic traffic that is associated with the end of the long weekend. So, please consider joining us on this pilgrimage which is such a part of Catholic culture. Consider going either as a walker or as a volunteer, as every part is important. Next week we shall begin selling our raffle tickets which will be our one big fundraiser for this event. As I said last week, we ask that you consider helping us sell some tickets (even if you are not attending) as funding FOPP is a form of evangelisation. Please consider taking 5 or 10 tickets to sell to your family or friends. This way we will be able to cover all our costs in advance. May God reward you.
