Pax Christi,

No doubt the consecrations of four new Bishops by the SSPX this last week will be in church headlines a lot in the near future. But, more than likely, as over the last 38 years, the situation will soon return to the status quo. At least that is the most likely scenario. The current situation is almost a carbon copy of the events in 1988. The excommunications were announced the day after the consecrations as they were before and then the SSPX went about doing what they do. I suspect that will be the case again. They have operated independently of Ecclesiastical authority since 1988, they performed these latest consecrations independently of Rome and going forward they will continue to operate in such a manner. For us who have chosen to attend the Latin Mass under the auspices of the FSSP under the authority of the Auckland Diocese, we must continue on our path toward sanctification as we have been commanded by our Blessed Lord (be ye holy, as my Father in heaven is holy). We are called to love God with our heart, soul, mind and strength, and our neighbour as ourselves. So, it falls upon us to pray for those who fall under the censure of excommunication, just as it is our duty to pray for all our neighbours. It behooves us to learn about what and how the excommunications come into force, who they affect and why. But let us not make judgement negatively in times of such sadness, rather let us work for reconciliation.

As we enter into school holidays, we will have classes for those who are preparing for first Holy Communion. The classes at St Anne's will be on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 10am to Noon and from 1pm to 3pm. For this reason the daily Mass schedule has been adjusted to help those attending the course make it to Masses. Please keep them in your prayers as they are working towards making their communions on Saturday 15th August on the Feast of the Assumption. This ties in with our 10th anniversary dinner in the evening at Blockhouse Bay Community Centre, 524 Blockhouse Bay Road, Blockhouse Bay. Also at the dinner we will draw the winner of our fundraising raffle for the FOPP pilgrimage. Please consider taking a few of the tickets for the raffle to sell among friends and family as they will help us to fund our pilgrimage in October. For the one who sells the most tickets I shall celebrate 10 Mass for their particular intentions. No stipend will need to be given for these Masses.
