Many thanks to those of you who have been praying rosaries for our spiritual bouquet for Bishop Lowe. I hope to be able to give him the bouquet as soon as next week. So, when you have finished, please collate your total and give them in to me. If you have prayed 15 decades a day (three Rosaries on our bouquet), you have done very well, as that will be 150 roses to the bouquet. Never fear, hand in your totals whatever they are. Bishop Lowe is due in Auckland this week and I will meet with him as the opportunity arrives. Also thanks to those who joined in the novena in preparation for the consecration of the FSSP to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, may God reward you.

Each year on the **Saturday before Ash Wednesday**, I have lead a penitential walk from St Therese in Mangere to the Cathedral. The aim is twofold ; firstly, to physically begin Lent with a long walk, praying the rosary and offering up any pain to God as penance for our offences, secondly ; to bring our bodies into subjection for the Lenten practices ahead. Unfortunately, this year the Legion of Mary (who I enlist for attendance) have been in a state of flux with meetings cancelled or only being held virtually. I have not (yet) arranged anything with the Sth Auckland Curia about this walk. But, it WILL go ahead. Watch this space next week for confirmation.

For this who did not hear, Fr Michael Ryan (known as Pa Ryan) of the Mill Hill Fathers died on Wednesday last week. Pa Ryan was ordained in 1953!, thereby serving the Lord for 69 years which is remarkable. Pa Ryan was a missionary to the Maori in the North and became so fluent in Te Reo that he even wrote a Maori dictionary. It was an honour to give him Extreme Unction and celebrate a Requiem Mass for the repose of his soul.

Let us never take anything for granted. God gives us His grace even though we do nothing to earn it. God gives us life, and has the right to reclaim it whenever He sees fit. God gives us the Sacraments when so many others have no access at all. Do your part to help build up the Church of God, and by your life, thank Him.

INTROIT

Psalm 17. 5, 6, 7, 17:2-3

The sorrows of death surrounded me, the sorrow of hell encompassed me: and in my affliction I called upon the Lord, and He heard my voice from His holy Temple. *Ps.* I will love Thee, O Lord, my strength: the Lord is my firmament, my refuge, and my deliverer. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

Graciously hear, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the prayers of Thy people, that we who are justly afflicted for our sins, may be mercifully delivered by Thy goodness, for the glory of Thy name. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE

1 Corinthians 9. 24-27; 10. 1-5

Brethren: Know you not that they that run in the race, all run indeed, but one receiveth the prize? So run that you may obtain. And every one that striveth for the mastery refraineth himself from all things: and they indeed that they may receive a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible one. I therefore so run, not as at an uncertainty; I so fight, not as one beating the air: but I chastise my body, and bring it into subjection, lest perhaps when I have preached to others, I myself should become a castaway. For I would not have you ignorant, brethren, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea, and all in Moses were baptized, in the cloud and in the sea: and did all eat the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink: (and they drank of the spiritual rock that followed them: and the rock was Christ). But with most of them God was not well pleased.

giveness, and by reason of Thy law I have waited for Thee, O Lord.

GOSPEL

Matthew 20:1-16

At that time Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: The kingdom of heaven is like to a householder who went out early in the morning to hire labourers into his vineyard. And having agreed with the labourers for a penny a day, he sent them into his vineyard. And going out about the third hour, he saw others standing in the marketplace idle, and he said to them: Go you also into my vineyard, and I will give you what shall be just. And they went their way. And again he went out about the sixth and the ninth hour: and did in like manner. But about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing, and he saith to them: Why stand you here all the day idle? They say to him: Because no man hath hired us. He saith to them: Go you also into my vineyard. And when evening was come, the lord of the vineyard saith to his steward: Call the labourers and pay them their hire, beginning from the last even to the first. When therefore they were come that came about the eleventh hour, they received every man a penny. But when the first also came, they thought that they should receive more: and they also received every man a penny. And receiving it they murmured against the master of the house, saying: These last have worked but one hour, and thou hast made them equal to us that have borne the burden of the day and the heats. But he answering said to one of them: Friend, I do thee no wrong: didst thou not agree with me for a penny? Take what is thine and go thy way: I will also give to this last even as to thee. Or, is it not lawful for me to do what I will? Is thy eye evil, because I am good? So shall the last be first, and the first last. For many are called, but few chosen.

- 1) The Gloria is omitted on Sunday and ferial days.
- 2) The alleluia is suppressed also the word alleluia wherever it occurs. The alleluia verse is replaced by the tract on Sundays and feast days.
- 3) The ferial Mass is the Mass of the preceding Sunday without Tract.

THE "TRAFFIC LIGHT" ARRANGEMENTS

St Anne's Chapel will **NOT** be using the "Vaccine Pass". Therefore, there will be no "Vaccinated only" Mass in the Latin Mass Chaplaincy. If you would like to attend such a Mass, please contact your local diocesan parish for information.

To satisfy the Ministry of Health guidelines during "**Red**"

- St Anne's Chapel will be open to the public, but all visitors **MUST** make sure they sign in or record their visit using the QR code. This must be done on every visit. If you are writing your details, you must use the paper slips and box provided.
 - All visitors are urged to make use of the hand sanitising materials provided.
- The maximum capacity inside St Anne's Chapel and Mt St Mary's Chapel is **25 people** following the social distancing rules.
- The following is on the government website; *You must wear a face mask at a gathering, except when the gathering is in a defined space that is only being used for the gathering.*
- Since our chapel and surrounds defines spaces which are only for the event (Mass), then masks are not mandated. They are, however, strongly recommended.
- During Mass, the elderly will have priority to be inside the chapel. If you are asked to leave the chapel (by one of the ushers) to make space for people who are more in need, please follow the instructions. Hopefully, charity will prevail.
- If you are attending by standing outside the chapel during Mass, please keep social distance rules.
- Confession will follow the normal daily pre-covid schedule and communion will be given **DURING** Mass.
- Please follow the instructions from the ushers in the high-viz vests at all times.
- If you are feeling sick or showing ANY signs of illness, stay at home and/or get a test.
- We all know that there is covid in the community. We all know it is going to spread. What we must try to avoid at all costs is our community becoming a spreader. So, let's do our best to follow the rules, be patient with each other and please respect the requests of the volunteers in the high-viz jackets. They are not doing their job for fun.
