Many thanks to all who participated in the annual Epiphany House blessings. It is a busy octave, with a lot of driving, a lot of blessings and also a lot of grace. It is always good to visit (albeit briefly) your homes. I hope those whose house were not visited were able to do the blessings themselves at their convenience.

There are a few things we need to keep our concentration on through prayers in the hope that our spiritual efforts will bear fruit. The first is the spiritual bouquet for Bishop Lowe. Remember, that our aim is to count up our 5 decade rosaries which we say daily, collate them as a. Community, then give them to Bishop Lowe as a combined bouquet of rosaries. As a general guide, if you are able to pray 3 of these rosaries a day (15 decades), then these will add up to a very healthy bouquet. Do what you can, don't underestimate how much more you can do. The second thing is our annual general meeting of the Latin Mass Chaplaincy members. I am suggesting **Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> of January** in the hall at Cole Place. If we start the meeting at **9.30am**, we would hope to be done in 2 hours. ## THE 2ND SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

### INTROIT

*Psalm 65. 4, 1-2*

Let all the earth adore Thee O God, and sing to Thee: let it sing a psalm to Thy name, O Most High. *Ps.* Shout with joy to God, all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His name: give glory to His praise *V* Glory be to the Father.

### COLLECT

Almighty and everlasting God who dost govern all things in heaven and earth, mercifully hear the prayers of Thy people, and grant us Thy peace all the days of our life. Through our Lord.

### EPISTLE

*Romans 12. 6-16*

Brethren: Having different gifts, according to the grace that is given us: either prophecy, to be used according to the rule of faith; or ministry, in ministering; or he that teacheth, in doctrine; he that exhorteth, in exhorting; he that giveth, with simplicity; he that ruleth, with carefulness; he that showeth mercy, with cheerfulness. Let love be without dissimulation. Hating that which is evil, cleaving to that which is good: loving one another with the charity of brotherhood, with honour preventing one another: in carefulness not slothful: in spirit fervent: serving the Lord: rejoicing in hope: patient in tribulation: instant in prayer: communicating to the necessities of the saints: pursuing hospitality. Bless them that persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that rejoice, weep with them that weep: being of one mind one towards another; not minding high things, but consenting to the humble.

### GOSPEL

*John 2. 1-11*

At that time there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee: and the mother of Jesus was there. And Jesus also was invited, and His disciples, to the marriage. And the wine failing, the mother of Jesus saith to Him: They have no wine. And Jesus saith to her: Woman, what is that to Me and to thee? My hour is not yet come. His mother saith to the waiters: Whatsoever He shall say to you, do ye. Now there were set there six waterpots of stone, according to the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three mea-

sures apiece. Jesus saith to them: Fill the waterpots with water. And they filled them up to the brim. And Jesus said to them: Draw out now, and carry to the chief steward of the feast. And they carried it. And when the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, and knew not whence it was, but the waiters knew who had drawn the water: the chief steward calleth the bridegroom, and saith to him: Every man at first setteth forth good wine: and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: but thou hast kept the good wine until now. This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee; and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him.

## THE "TRAFFIC LIGHT" ARRANGEMENTS

To satisfy the Ministry of Health guidelines during alert level "Orange"

- St Anne's Chapel will be open to the public, but all visitors **MUST** make sure they sign in or record their visit using the QR code. This must be done on every visit. If you are writing your details, you must use the paper slips and box provided.

- All visitors **MUST** make use of the hand sanitising materials provided.

- All visitors **MUST** have a mask.

- The maximum capacity inside St Anne's Chapel and Mt St Mary's Chapel is 50 people following the social distancing rules.

- During Mass, the elderly will have priority to be inside the chapel. If you are asked to leave the chapel (by one of the ushers) to make space for people who are more in need, please follow the instructions. Hopefully, charity will prevail.

- If you are attending by standing outside the chapel during Mass, please keep social distance rules.

- Confession will follow the normal daily pre-covid schedule and communion will be given DURING Mass.

- If you are near the chapel and also watching the livestream during Mass, please use headphones. The livestream has a 1 minute delay and it is distracting for people around you.

- Please follow the instructions from the ushers in the high-viz vests at all times.

- If you are feeling sick or showing ANY signs of illness, stay at home and/or get a test.

- We all know that there is covid in the community. We all know it is going to spread. What we must try to avoid at all costs is our community becoming a spreader. So, let's do our best to follow the rules, be patient with each other and please respect the requests of the volunteers in the high-viz jackets. They are not doing their job for fun.
