Pax Christi,

Tomorrow is the Feast of St Luke, the 18th October, it is also the anniversary of the foundation of the FSSP. On that day 33 years ago the FSSP was formerly founded with the blessing of Pope St John Paul II, for the sanctification of priests (and by extension the sanctification of those whose care they have). Just before the foundation of the FSSP, a small number of priests and seminarians made the decision to leave the SSPX due to the consecrations of Bishops without the Papal mandate, to travel to Rome and ask the Holy See if they would be able to help in founding a congregation with a charism having the traditional Latin Mass at its heart. Through the initiative of Josef Cardinal Ratzinger and the support of the Pope, the FSSP was erected shortly after.

For those who were not involved at that time (1988), much of what happened then is old history, but unless we learn from the lessons of history, we will be condemned to repeat the same mistakes. At the time the small group left the SSPX they were treated as traitors. They received verbal abuse, personal attacks against their person, courage, faith and even sanity. They were scorned and warned that they would never be welcomed by any good traditionalists and that they were, in effect, banished. One of the main avenues of argumentation or mockery is that they had "sold-out" and that they would have to pay with the 'pound of flesh.' They were assured, that as they did not have Bishops of their own to do their ordinations, then they would not survive and they would all be saying the Novus Ordo within a short time. Obviously, this has not happened, and for this we give thanks to God.

The lesson to learn from this is to ask 'for what reason did those founders go to Rome to meet with the Pope?' The reason is one of faith. They knew that Christ had given His word that the "gates of hell shall not prevail" and that when Christ said that, we all have to believe it with a full faith. Today's epistle clearly states "For our wrestling is not against flesh and blood, but against principalities and powers, against the rulers of the world of this darkness, against the spirits of wickedness in the high places." Therefore, no matter how dark things appear to be (and they are certainly not looking great!), Christ has given us His promise that He will not abandon His Church. The battle is spiritual. We must grow holier WITHIN the barque of Peter, even when it appears as if it is floundering. The FSSP will not save the Church (to suggest so, is ridiculous), the Church will save the FSSP, and (by extension) all of us who are living our faith.

At that time, Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: The kingdom of Heaven is likened to a king, who would take an account of his servants. And when he had begun to take the

account, one was brought to him that owed him ten thousand talents: and as he had not wherewith to pay it, his lord commanded that he should be sold, and his wife and children, and all that he had, and payment be made. But that servant falling down, besought him saying: Have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. And the lord of that servant, being moved with pity, let him go and forgave him the debt. But when that servant was gone out, he found one of his fellow servants that owed him a hundred pence: and laying hold of him, he throttled him, saying: Pay what thou owest. And his fellow servant falling down besought him, saying: have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. And he would not but went and cast him into prison till he paid the debt. ST ANTHONY MARY CLARET

St. Anthony was born in Spain in 1807, the fifth of 11 children in a poor weaving family. He was inspired by his parents' faith and devotion from an early age. By 21, St Anthony was in high demand as a weaver, but he suffered from ill health.

He had a vision of himself as a Carthusian monk, and after seeking advice from his bishop, joined the seminary.

After his ordination, St Anthony worked in the missions for 10 years. In 1849, he founded the Claretian order.

He was then assigned as archbishop of Santiago, Cuba, and made many changes to inspire new faith and growth in his diocese. He reorganised the seminary training program and traveled to all the churches in his diocese to celebrate Mass and hear confessions. Not all his renewals were spiritual — he taught black slaves, and worked to improve farming methods so that people could own their own farms. He was targeted for his radical changes, and 15 assassination attempts were made on his life.

After eight years as archbishop, St Anthony was sent to Spain to be the confessor to Queen Isabella II. He arranged with her that he would not live at the palace, but would come to hear confessions and teach her children. While in Spain, he opened a religious publishing house, and wrote more than 200 books and pamphlets.

In 1886, St Anthony and Queen Isabella were exiled during the Spanish Revolution. He returned to Rome to defend the infallibility of the Pope at Vatican I, and then went to a Cistercian monastery in France, where he died in 1870.

St. Anthony was canonised in 1950.
