School holidays are coming to an end, so back to school the kids go and a few will start their schooling as well. There is a new school starting in Auckland called Tōtara Point and some of our families have enrolled children. There is an advertisement on the last page of the bulletin. For our information, the Bishop of Auckland contacted the priests in the Diocese and said the following : *“In 2024, having heard that plans were in the pipeline, I met with representatives of the Pared network who were behind the school. As bishop, I have a pastoral responsibility to ensure that when a school or organisation presents itself as ‘Catholic’, it does so with integrity and in full communion with the Church’s teaching and leadership. Having met with the organisers, I contacted Bishops of Dioceses in Australia, where other Pared schools were already operating. They gave me no reason to object to the establishment of the school.”* I put this note here today also in support of this new initiative for those people working at the school and those families who are either enrolled or considering joining.

Next Saturday will be the last day before we enter Septuagesima and as such we will be singing Vespers at St Anne's at 5.30pm. The last chanted words of the Vespers service are, *“Benedicāmus Dōmino, allelūia, allelūia. Deo Grāτίας, allelūia, allelūia.”* After that, (liturgically speaking) the Alleluia is removed from the liturgy until its return on Easter Sunday. So, as we did a few years ago, we will take a scroll with the word ‘Alleluia’ written on it and go outside the chapel to ‘bury’ the alleluia. The box containing the Alleluia will remain in the ground until resurrecting on Easter Sunday. Feel free to join us for Vespers and the burial ceremony and after that we shall enjoy a BBQ and some social time at St Anne's.

Thanks for your ongoing prayers in preparation for the FSSP renewal of the consecration to our Lady on 11th February. Fr John Berg, Superior General of the FSSP met with the Holy Father this last week. Fr Berg will be in Auckland next month & can give us an update on that meeting then.

REMEMBER, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thy intercession, was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my Mother. To thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful.
