‘Brethren: Understand, for it is now the hour for us to rise from sleep, because now our salvation is nearer than when we came to believe. The night is far advanced; the day is at hand. Let us therefore lay aside the works of darkness, and put on the armour of light.’

Thus speaks the great apostle Paul, given to us in the Epistle of the First Sunday of Advent, as we enter into this beautiful season of preparation for the coming of Our Saviour. The liturgical year begins today, and we are provided with a wonderful opportunity during this time to reinvigorate our faith, to take stock and assess where we could perhaps be doing better in conforming ourselves to Our Lord.

The weeks of Advent are a great help in this regard. We have in them – and in the liturgical preparations of which our Holy Mother the Church makes use – many and pointed helps for us at the level of our interior life. The interchange between, and play upon, the image of darkness and light is a constant refrain throughout the liturgies of this holy season, and these constant images remind us of our need to rely more completely upon Our Lord, to conform ourselves more fully to Him, and to do what is in us to make this season of preparation a worthy one. This may take a number of forms: meditating on the readings of the season, adding to our devotions one particularly suited to Advent, or making those efforts needed in our own personal prayer. Whatever we may choose to do, let us do so for the love of the Christ-child, who comes to us in love, and for love of us did all and gave all that we might be reconciled to the Father.

‘The people that walked in darkness, have seen a great light: to them that dwelt in the region of the shadow of death, light is risen... for a child is born to us, and a son is given to us, and the government is upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called, Wonderful, Counsellor, God the Mighty, the Father of the world to come, the Prince of Peace.’

The great prophet Isaiah gives us hope with these words. Let us strive to be children of the light, as we prepare to welcome the Christ-child into our midst.

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

INTROIT

Psalm 24: 1-3

To Thee have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust, let me not be ashamed: neither let my enemies laugh at me: for none of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded. *Ps.* Show, O Lord, Thy ways to me: and teach me Thy paths. *℣* Glory be...

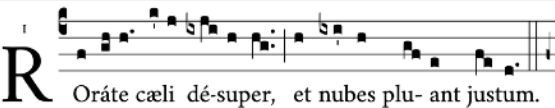

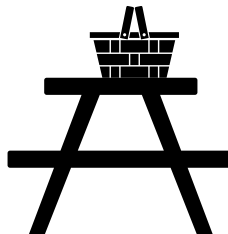
