As the Feast of St Michael is on a Tuesday and many of you will not be able to attend the 7am morning Mass, I will have a second Mass at 7pm at Mount St Mary's. Another small detail for this week will be the moving of the Friday Mass time for this week only. Due to the Saturday ordination, and the amount of work needing to be done on the Friday, and also the Definitive Incorporation into the FSSP of Brendan Boyce, I will move the Friday Mass to 7am.

We are all having to get used to so many "new normals" and one of these is Mass time changes due to lockdowns. I can assure you that we take no more joy in these constant time changes than you do being on the receiving end of them.

As to the ordination it is a real heartbreak for all that we are restricted to only 100 in attendance, especially given the possibility of Auckland going to Level 1 a few days later. But then again, we are a government decision away from another Level 4! So we must take this opportunity now while we have the chance. Both Mr Boyce and Deacon Gilbride have had too many delays and postponements and another one which is not absolutely necessary is not going to delay the ordination.

I ask specifically for your prayers for both our Sub-Deacon and Deacon as they make these great strides toward the altar of God. "Introibo ad altare Dei."

By the grace of Thy sacraments, almighty God, may our passions be subdued and our eternal salvation assured. Through our Lord.





ST. REMIGIUS OF RHEIMS

St. Remigius or Remi, Bishop of Rheims was the great apostle of the Franks, and was illustrious for his learning, sanctity and miracles, which in his episcopacy of seventy and more years, rendered his name famous in the church. When only twenty-two, he was chosen in 459 to fill the vacant See of Rheims. He was ordained and consecrated in spite of his youth, and amply made up for lack of experience by his fervor and energy.

Under the protection of King Clovis, who was baptized by Remigius, St. Remigius spread the gospel of Christ among the Franks, in which work God endowed him with an extraordinary gift of miracles. The bishops who were assembled in a conference that was held at Lyons against the Arians in his time, declared they were stirred to exert their zeal in defense of the Catholic Faith by the example of Remigius, "who", say they, "has everywhere destroyed the altars of the idols by a multitude of miracles and signs."
