Pax Christi,

As we continue to adjust to our new 'normal' on Sundays, we should be reminded that charity covereth a multitude of sins. It may not be to your liking that you cannot be in the chapel for Mass, or that you are in the hot sun, or some children are playing on the grass in front of you, causing you to get angry. These are however, nothing more than distractions which (however subtly) reflect one's own spiritual fitness. There is a price to pay to come to the Latin Mass. It may be you lose some Catholic "friends", or that you are made fun of, or that you have to hear some uncomfortable truths, or perhaps at the other end of the spectrum, you are getting approached to join in any number of odd devotional groups, or 'prayer groups' which leave you feeling decidedly ill-fitting. Perhaps your reaction to this barrage is to turn up to Mass, receive communion and book-it out of there before you get collared by someone. So be it. But I'd like you to look at the other side of the coin.

You have made a conscious decision to attend the Latin Mass, knowing that it is going to be treated like a second class citizen. But, if this is where you find you can encounter God the best, then what price is too high? If you lose friends over taking the faith too 'seriously' or insisting on Latin Mass, then, make new friends who also are trying this way to heaven. If those spikes from the pulpit hurt, suck them up. It is better to hear them now, than after your judgement. If people are asking you to join in with any number of odd devotions, even if they sell them as legitimate. If they don't sit well with you, ask me! I might find them weird as well! If you can't navigate your way around the missal or the Mass, fear not. Plebs and peasants for centuries have managed to become holy, by eating a bit of humble pie, and trying again in all patience.

Fear not, become a bit more comfortable with this uncomfortable. The best way to acclimatise, is to spend some time in different conditions. Come and speak with me, or arrange a meeting to talk about what it is that concerns you. Apart from Epiphany house blessing week, my door is open, and all are welcome. I can help you, you can help you, AND you can help us (grow).

THE FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY

INTROIT *Proverbs 23:24, 25, Psalm 83:2-3*

The father of the Just rejoiceth greatly, let Thy father and Thy mother be joyful, and let her rejoice that bore Thee. *Ps.* How lovely are Thy tabernacles, O Lord of Hosts; my soul longeth and fainteth for the courts of the Lord. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT

THE “TRAFFIC LIGHT” ARRANGEMENTS

St Anne’s Chapel will NOT be using the “Vaccine Pass”. Therefore, there will be no “Vaccinated only” Mass in the Latin Mass Chaplaincy. If you would like to attend such a Mass, please contact your local diocesan parish for information.

To satisfy the Ministry of Health guidelines during alert level “Orange”

- St Anne’s Chapel will be open to the public, but all visitors **MUST** make sure they sign in or record their visit using the QR code. This must be done on every visit. If you are writing your details, you must use the paper slips and box provided.

- All visitors **MUST** make use of the hand sanitising materials provided.

- All visitors **MUST** have a mask.

- The maximum capacity inside St Anne’s Chapel and Mt St Mary’s Chapel is 50 people following the social distancing rules.

- During Mass, the elderly will have priority to be inside the chapel. If you are asked to leave the chapel (by one of the ushers) to make space for people who are more in need, please follow the instructions. Hopefully, charity will prevail.

- If you are attending by standing outside the chapel during Mass, please keep social distance rules.

- Confession will follow the normal daily pre-covid schedule and communion will be given DURING Mass.

- If you are near the chapel and also watching the livestream during Mass, please use headphones. The livestream has a 1 minute delay and it is distracting for people around you.

- Please follow the instructions from the ushers in the high-viz vests at all times.

- If you are feeling sick or showing ANY signs of illness, stay at home and/or get a test.

- We all know that there is covid in the community. We all know it is going to spread. What we must try to avoid at all costs is our community becoming a spreader. So, let’s do our best to follow the rules, be patient with each other and please respect the requests of the volunteers in the high-viz jackets. They are not doing their job for fun.
